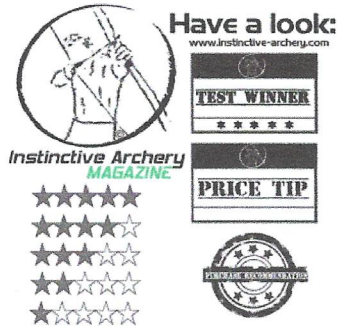

In our **recurve bow test** we face in the future, different models for archery friends and choose in our opinion, the best bows.

On a course, an Archery Range or roving there are different requirements for a bow.

We test the bow „out of the box“ as supplied by the manufacturer.

Please check back from time to time to read more tests.

Our criteria are:

- Processing Total / Limbs
- Used material
- Weight / Handling
- Noise
- Abstract softness / smoothness draw
- Fun – purely subjective
- Price-performance

The best recurve bows compared

For the reviews in our tests, we go, both on the price differences, the processing, as well as customer reviews we get on Facebook.

The subject arrow speed does not matter in our tests.

In the test, it is clear that there are high-priced and also large differences.

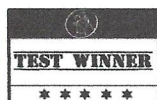
It should be taken into account when buying that the limbs have a good finish and weight.

The issue of safety is important at the bow. Broken limbs that can hit in the face, are very dangerous. Generally speaking, the small, local bowyers nowadays are at least the same quality as that of larger manufacturers that mass produce of large quantities.

In a period of 3 years, you should emphasize. Longer warranty periods are pure marketing, because bows if at all, usually show their flaws in the first months.

Our previous winner Bearpaw Big Bear had to give up the crown.

JC3 Arqueria this is a name to remember.

The newcomer from Brazil has beautiful wood species (of course, there are no protected woods) in combination with extraordinary shot tranquility and processing. Their bows are in the usual draw weights from 25 lbs to 60 lbs, which allows anyone to afford this beautiful bow.

The takedown is elegantly shaped and reminds us in the white variant an Elven Bow. 😊

This is a high-precision recurve bow, which will give you a lot of fun. The bow is clearly designed for the middle class.

The hand shock is very limited and the shot noise is pleasant.

Conclusion: High-quality all-rounder with additionally good appearance and design.
